Letter from the President

Dear Friends,

As always I hope you and your family are staying healthy. It has been a long seven months for us all but with everyone's help we can slowly but steadily return to what will certainly be a new normal.

I would like to open by extending the Friends sincerest best wishes to Mrs. (Margi) Rossetti who retired last month after serving as the Children's Library Supervisor for 31 years. Margi always made every child who visited the library feel special and took the time to help them find the perfect book. She brought in enrichment programs for children of all ages, including her wonderful story hours and annual Teddy Bear Picnic. She has served the town's youngest library patrons well and will be sorely missed.

We are so fortunate to have the library open as many area libraries have chosen to remain closed. The staff has done a phenomenal job taking all the necessary precautions to keep the library a safe environment – masks for all, plenty of hand sanitizer, protective shielding, signage, social distancing and sanitizing protocols. While the library hours have been reduced, additional hours will be phased in as conditions permit and curbside pickup remains an option.

The Friends recently conducted a survey to gauge interest in a fall book sale. We are excited to report that there was tremendous interest and we will therefore be working hard to put together a sale in November. We anticipate a smaller scale event, perhaps by appointment, to allow for social distancing. Masks will be required and we will ask people to use hand sanitizer before entering. Please stay tuned!

I would like to reiterate that at this time our book collection bin is not available. Our storage room is full and the requirement to quarantine books before making them available for sale exacerbates the situation. We are seeking small donations (i.e. one or two bags) of gently used recent Best Sellers and Children's books to help keep our Book Shops current. To make such a donation leave your contact information with the library staff and a board member will be in touch. Please bear with us during this complex time.








Fall Book Sale: November 5-7


