The Boyden Library had a tremendously successful summer program thanks to the Friends of Boyden Library supporting numerous programs and purchasing prizes for participants of all ages!

In addition to the fantastic summer programs, we introduced several improvements aimed at benefitting our community. Some of these include:

- Expanding our offerings with two new electronic resources, now available to all patrons:
- Niche Academy which delivers immediate accessible online trainings on the eresources that the Boyden Library provides as well as trainings for other platforms and software such as Facebook, Microsoft Excel, etc.
- Brainfuse offers live online tutoring for all learners. Patrons can access real-time assistance through the online classrooms. Live tutors are available online between the hours of 2-11pm.
- Growing our Library of Things collection to include an array of items, featuring a Bluetooth sound bar, a stud finder, sunoculars, a food dehydrator, a karaoke machine, an Oculus, and more.
- Creating a Board Game collection for adults with titles such as: Catan, Cards Against Humanity, Azul, and Scrabble.

Members are welcome to bring a guest who may be interested in hearing more about what the Friends do. We will have membership forms for anyone wanting to join, which will be good through December 2024.




