What an extraordinary year it has been for Boyden Library! We successfully implemented a dynamic 5-year Strategic Plan, inaugurated a Seed Lending Library, and significantly expanded our program offerings for patrons of all ages in 2023 with 149 Adult programs, 75 Teen programs and 298 Children's programs. These accomplishments would not have been possible without the generous support of the Friends of Boyden Library.

As we step into 2024, Boyden Library proudly remains a pillar of knowledge, connection, and cultural enrichment in our community. Some noteworthy initiatives in the new year include:

1. Partnering with the Mass Center for the Book 2024 Reading Challenge. If

#### **2024 ANNUAL MEMBERSHIPS NOW DUE**

The Friends of Boyden Library 2024 Membership Drive has begun! Over one-third of our income in 2023 came from membership dues and monetary donations. Joining or renewing membership is an integral part of the Friends success.

Your financial support helped sponsor a variety of programs in 2023. These included passes for the Museum of Science, discounted tickets to the Southwick Zoo, and one Wifi hotspot. The Friends also supported craft and floral supplies for the Adult, Teen, and Youth departments.

The Friends sponsored 28 Adult programs and concerts, including the very popular potting workshop, Dustin Pari program, and Hollow Turtle concert.

The Friends brought 9 programs to the Teen Department. Some of the more well-attended programs were the Escape Room, Shadow Boxes, and Paint an Axoloti. The Friends also provided games and gaming supplies for the Teen Room, prizes, and supplies for school visits and the Makerspace.

The Friends sponsored 19 children's programs, as well as prizes for the Summer Reading Program. Programs included the always popular Teddy Bear Picnic, Mike the Bubble Man, Poop Museum, and Wide World of Reptiles.

This donation is in addition to two donations we received from our wonderful patrons Ilyas Taj and Jayden Onwuakor. We will now be able to buy 8 Chromebooks in total to use for a future kids' coding club and for several other projects and programs.
- We are continuing to grow our Tween collection by adding Graphic Novels. Also, our Holiday section is complete and categorized by the month.
