We also extend our heartfelt gratitude to the Friends of Boyden Library for their generous support, which played a pivotal role in making many of these programs possible.

As we embark on 2025, Boyden Library proudly continues to serve as a vibrant, inclusive community hub – providing all patrons free access to resources and fostering connections through impactful programs and services. This year, we would like to announce several


GIVING TREE and HOLIDAY BOOK DRIVE


