Reflecting upon 2022, we were certainly pleased with the amount we accomplished! One of our goals was to begin expanding programming for patrons of all ages and I believe that we successfully achieved exactly that! Some of the new, regularly scheduled library programs now include: a monthly Boyden Library Book Club, book walks/talks, a Saturday afternoon LEGO Club, weekly Dungeons & Dragons teen program, crafting workshops for all ages, and story time programs 3-4 times a week. We hired our first Teen Librarian, Jennifir Huston, who has done an exceptional job connecting with the Foxborough community and implementing a variety of teen programs.

In addition, we are really excited to now offer our patrons 2-3 virtual author talks a

## **TEEN HAPPENINGS AT BOYDEN LIBRARY**



The Teen Librarianship has been a whirlwind of getting to know the Teens of Foxboro, hosting programming, ordering books, and slowly revamping the Teen Room itself. I created an online survey to hear from Teens who are unable to attend the Teen Advisory Board (TAB) meetings. This has proved helpful in all aspects of provisions for Teens only. Every TAB meeting has had attendance with new members joining. Cosplay Club has not been successful so I will be switching gears per the Survey by creating a Crafting Club. The first Teen Book Club has been launched. Fashion for Breast Cancer in November was highly successful with many blankets made for patients at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute.

January is proving to be an eventful month with the Yeti Lumanaria program sponsored by the Friends (Friday January 13), Madden Tournament at Helix eSports at Patriot Place, a partnership with many libraries hosted by Tewksbury Public Library for a Young Adult author talk between Maureen Johnson and Jennifer Lynn Barnes,

and a furniture proposal to make the Teen Room more inviting! I have also volunteered to be the Chair of the South Shore Young Adult Round Table.

In February and March, I will be hosting a crafting program using Creativebug and local Young Adult author Kelly Andrew will be giving an author talk on her debut novel *Whispering Dark*. The Friends will be sponsoring a Japanese Onigiri rice roll program hosted by the Japan Boston Society (February 18 still to be confirmed) and a filmmaking four-day class session in March (8, 15, 22, 29) via Zoom.

I have been fortunate to connect with two teens who volunteer to help with anything from making flyers to helping me during the December flower program. It is a great way to get to know them and give them yet another avenue to be a part of something.


